

ISC II Home League and Ontario Cup Roster Guidelines

1. All rosters are subject to approval by Ontario ISC II Staff and are capped at 18. Teams may pick up any two ISC II-eligible players from within their league. Pick-ups must indicate to Ontario ISC II staff from which team they are being selected.
2. Roster members of teams with automatic berths to the following year's ToC (if any) are not eligible as pick-ups for the ISC II Ontario Cup.

Example: If Port Elgin wins the 2005 ToC and has an automatic berth in 2006, then Rob Fawcett, Scott Christie or any other member of Port Elgin would NOT be eligible to be picked up by Owen Sound if Owen Sound is representing the Blue Water league at the ISC II Ontario Cup.

3. Players who were pick-ups on teams (if any) who have an automatic berth to the following year's ToC and who competed in the ISC II Ontario Cup for their own league team but did not qualify for the ToC, may play for the team with the automatic berth in the following year. However, they must be counted toward that team's allotment of three pick-ups.

Example: Terry Martin played for Breslau as per the above, but Breslau did not qualify. Terry is permitted to play with Harriston in 2005, but he will count as one of Harriston's three pick-ups. (Note that this example was written prior to Breslau's folding. If Terry plays with Harriston as part of their league team, then he would not be considered a pick-up.)

- 3.1 Players who were pick-ups on teams (if any) who have an automatic berth to the following year's ToC and who competed in the ISC II Ontario Cup for their own league team and qualify for the ToC must play for their league team in the ToC.

Example: Terry Martin played for Breslau as per the above. If Breslau had qualified for the 2005 ToC, Terry must play for Breslau ahead of Harriston.

4. Roster members of the team that wins the ISC II Ontario Cup are not eligible for play in the following year's Ontario ISC II qualifier(s) unless they leave the team roster as per 5 below.
5. If a player (roster or pick-up) qualifies for the ToC with a team as a result of winning the ISC II Ontario Cup, but leaves the team in the off-season, that player is eligible to play for any other team for the purposes of an Ontario qualifier or the ToC as long as he notifies Ontario ISC II staff no later than June 1. However, he may NOT go back to the team that he left if his new team does not qualify for the ToC.

Example 1: Rob Fawcett leaves the Port Elgin roster in the winter of 2004 and signs with Niagara Snappers in 2005 and notifies Ontario ISC II Staff prior to June 1, 2005 of his intent to play for the Snappers in the qualifier. If the Snappers do not qualify for the ToC, Rob can be picked up by any team other than Port Elgin for the ToC and will count as one of that team's pick-ups.

Example 2: Norwich picks up Adam Martin and wins the ISC II Ontario Cup and a berth in the next ToC. However Adam wants to play with his own team, Ingersoll, in the following year's qualifier. He can do so as long as he notifies Ontario ISC II Staff prior to June 1, 2005. However, Adam may NOT be picked up by Norwich if Ingersoll doesn't qualify.
